Dear Marlboro Township Residents,

It is with great pride that we present to you the 2012 Township Recycling Calendar.

Please take some time to go through the calendar and note the important dates and regulations that help our recycling programs run smoothly. Recycling is not only environmentally smart but helps improve the Township's bottom line.

Over the past year, our Township secured a recycling grant which funded the purchase of containers that are used in our Recycling Yard. With these containers, the Township is now able to transport and market paper, plastic, cardboard and other fibers at a reduced cost. An added benefit is that the Township collects rebates for the materials brought to market.

In 2011, we entered into a shared services agreement with the County allowing residents to bring electronics and computers to our yard. This recycling program is offered at no cost to the taxpayers and provides an additional revenue stream to the Township, subject to market conditions.

We also offered a paper shredding event which provided residents with a safe and secure way of disposing of old documents. We intend on sponsoring another paper shredding event in the Spring—please stay tuned to the Township's web site for more information.

I encourage everyone to continue to be diligent about recycling and educating our kids about its benefits. As Mayor, I will continue to work hard to improve our recycling programs and deliver services in the most cost effective manner possible.

As a reminder, the Township has an active "Green Team" which offers many exciting programs to help us become more environmentally sensitive and energy efficient. I invite all residents to join us in May for our Community Pride Day, an annual celebration of all that this Township accomplishes through the efforts of its hundreds of active and passionate volunteers.

Kindly note the following with respect to the publication:

- * **The Township encourages all our residents to practice the 3 R's "Reduce, Recycle and Reuse". Please read the additional information in this publication to learn more about these important practices.**
- * **We ask that all our residents carefully review the regulations outlined in this publication for the purpose of insuring that all materials are picked up on a timely and cost effective manner in compliance with the applicable laws.**

The Department of Public Works (DPW) strives very hard to meet all of the needs of our residents and address all concerns in a timely and professional manner. Please understand that the majority of the DPW work schedules are subject to weather conditions. If you have any service requests, please feel free to call the office and we will do our best to address all of your concerns. DPW consists of *five* separate bureaus:

- **BUILDINGS & GROUNDS MAINTENANCE:** Maintains and repairs all Township buildings at the Municipal Complex, Municipal Swim Club, Recreation Community Center, Public Library, Morganville Senior Center, and all First Aid Squads. This bureau also oversees the Township recycling yard and curbside pickup.
- **FLEET MAINTENANCE:** Maintains and repairs all Township vehicles and provides fleet fueling services to the Board of Education, Municipal Utilities Authority (water), Fire Companies, and First Aid Squads.
- **SIGN SHOP:** Responsible for all signage in the Township, public information signs, as well as, line striping for all roads and Township owned parking lots.
- **PARKS & PLAYGROUND MAINTENANCE:** Maintains and repairs over 233 acres of Township parks, playgrounds, and recreation areas.
- **ROADS MAINTENANCE:** Responsible for 738 named streets (covering over 213.5 miles), leaf/brush pick up, snow removal, and general road repairs.

Special Needs: Residents may contact Marlboro Township ADA Compliance Officer Robert DiMarco at 732 536-0188, to discuss special needs assistance.

CLEAN COMMUNITIES/RECYCLING has been funded by grants since 1986. Although the State of New Jersey has reduced revenue awards to most municipalities, the Township has still been able to fund projects such as the purchase and maintenance of recycling containers at our parks, athletic fields, and public buildings. The Clean Communities Grant and additional municipal monies are also applied to staffing the Recycling Center, paying for roadside cleanups, supporting Community Pride Day, and underwriting other important educational programs. This Division also coordinates the efforts of volunteer groups who help remove litter from roads, streams, and parks within Marlboro Township.

Directions: The Municipal Complex Recycling Center is located behind the School Bus Garage at the end of Lotta Burke Way, which is the first left off Township Drive.

RECYCLING CENTER RULES

- The Center requires proof of residency to drop off any item. A driver's license is needed as identification. No Contractors are allowed into the Recycle Center. No Vehicles with Commercial, Farmer or Dealer license plates will be allowed into the Recycle Center.
- Only clean recycables are accepted at the Center. No items may be left outside the fence when the facility is closed. **Violators will be fined.**
- Leaves (accepted year-round) must be emptied from their bags or containers, which then must be removed from the Center.
- Cardboard must be bundled in 2'x2'x1' stacks.
- Tissues, paper towels, and carbon paper are not accepted.
- Corrugated brown paper, grocery bags, telephone books, and newspapers must be recycled separately.
- Propane Tanks must be emptied and valves opened (propane tanks require a permit for disposal).

To dispose of hazardous waste, paint, liquid gas, pesticides, car oil, car batteries, and pool chemicals, you must call for an appointment. You will be asked to describe the amounts and types of materials requiring disposal. Materials must be in marked containers with their original labels affixed. Up to 200 pounds of dry material or 20 gallons of liquid are permitted per visit. No container can be larger than 5 gallons.

RECYCLING INSTRUCTIONS

Biweekly Collections for Zones 1 – 8

Place Items Curbside by 7:00AM on Designated Dates

Please follow your regular bi-weekly collection dates as noted on the Month-by-Month Calendar. There are no scheduled pickups on Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day.

Recyclable items can be dropped at the Township Recycling Center on Mondays and Wednesdays 8:00am -1:30pm and Saturdays 8:00am - 4:00pm.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND RULES

- All food, beverage, and detergent containers should be rinsed and placed together (co-mingled) in an unlined, rigid, reusable plastic container. The container should be no larger than 32 gallons. There should not be an attached cover. If you chose to have a cover, that is not attached, please make sure that the container is labeled "Recycle". Labels can be obtained from the Public Works Department, or you can write directly on your container. Do not use corrugated boxes or paper/plastic bags. Only items placed curbside will be collected.
- It is not necessary for you to remove labels from your recyclable bottles, cans, and containers. Items may be crushed.
- Failure to cooperate may result in monetary fines for violating recycling laws.

RECYCLING ITEMS ACCEPTED CURBSIDE

1. Commingled materials which are;
 - a. Aluminum food and beverage containers
 - b. Glass food and beverage containers (brown, clear, or green)
 - c. Ferrous (Iron) cans
 - d. PET plastic containers with the symbol #1 – with screw tops only
 - e. HDPE natural plastic containers with the symbol #2 – narrow neck containers only (milk and water bottles)
 - f. HDPE pigmented plastic containers with the symbol #2 – narrow neck containers only (detergent, shampoo bottles, etc.)
 - g. Plastics with symbols #3, #4, #5, #6, #7-narrow and screw top containers
2. Mixed paper material which are:
 - a. Newsprint
 - b. Old corrugated cardboard
 - c. Magazines
 - d. Catalogs
 - e. Cereal boxes
 - f. Telephone books
 - g. Printer paper
 - h. Copier paper
 - i. Mail
 - j. All other office paper without wax liners

ASKED

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

What will happen if I put items out after my scheduled pickup date?

Materials may be brought to the Municipal Recycling Center or you may contact a private hauler. If the violation continues, steps may be taken by the Township in accordance with Chapter 72 of the Code of the Township of Marlboro. Yard debris can create dangerous conditions: flooding, skidding, slipping, sight distance blockage, and fire hazards from dry leaves.

What should I do if my recycling is missed?

If you placed your recycling curbside before 7AM and it is after 5PM, you can call the Recycling Office at 732-536-9295 and we will call the recycling contractor to correct the error. The office will ask what you have out and if it was prepared within the correct guidelines as outlined in the 2011 Recycling Calendar.

What should I do if my street light is out?

Street lights, while on Township property, are not owned or maintained by the Township. Once you have the pole number, which is located on the pole, you can call JCP&L at 1-800-662-3115. You may also go to the First energy web site at www.firstenergy.com and follow the prompts on the site. For further assistance, you may call DPW at 732 536-0188.

What do I do with Bulk Garbage?

Bulk Garbage can be brought to the Township Recycle Yard (please see page 4), or can be picked up during spring clean up (see page 10), or call your private hauler for assistance.

While recycling is part of the solution for preserving landfill space, the best option is to reduce the amount of waste that is generated in the first place.



Green Shopping


- Do not buy what you don't need. Try to avoid shopping impulsively or without a list.
- Give a lasting "trash free" gift of an experience: movie, concert or theater tickets, or a gift certificate for dinner or a special event. Make a donation to a favorite charity on someone's behalf.
- Give gifts of yourself, such as babysitting, washing the car, doing housework or running errands.
- Choose toys and tools that use rechargeable batteries.
- Buy products that are durable and will last, instead of poorly-made products that could end up in the trash. Look for long term warranties.
- Use reusable cloth shopping bags, or consolidate many purchases into one or a few bags, instead of taking a bag for every purchase.
- Select items packaged in recycled or recyclable materials. Look for the recycling symbol.
- Buy gift wrap and cards made from recycled paper.
- Give yourself or your family an environmental gift such as memberships or donations to environmental organizations, subscriptions to environmental magazines, or books on environmental topics.

Sending Cards and Packages

- Up to 20% of all mail is incorrectly addressed! Save time, money and resources by updating your mailing list. If each of us sent one fewer card, we could eliminate 50,000 cubic yards of paper waste!
- Reuse packaging cartons and shipping materials. Shredded newspaper makes for excellent packing material.

Wrapping it up

- Skip wrapping altogether! Decorate items with bows, or place in gift baskets or bags, which can be used again.
- Wrap gifts in the Sunday comics or decorate brown paper bags (inside out) for wrapping gifts.
- Avoid using boxes when possible, or reuse boxes.
- Wrap gifts in recycled paper.



Party Practices

- Use reusable cloth napkins, tablecloths and washable plates, silverware and cups, wherever possible, instead of disposables.
- When using disposable paper party supplies, choose recycled plates, napkins and paper towels.
- Make your party place festive without creating excessive waste by decorating with reusable items.
- When giving or attending parties and dinners, make sure to locate recycling containers.

After the Holidays

- Save cards to use as next year's postcards or gift tags.
- Put gift wrap (non-metallic) and cards aside and recycle them in your municipal recycling program. Call your municipal recycling coordinator for information before saving materials for recycling.
- Call your local recycling coordinator to find out how your tree can be recycled into mulch.
- Save and reuse gift boxes.

Environmental Shopping & Waste Prevention

What is it?

In addition to recycling, reusing and composting your waste, there are steps you can take to ensure that the non-recyclable waste you create is minimal — steps you can take BEFORE the garbage is created.

WASTE PREVENTION means reducing the volume and toxicity of waste destined for disposal at our landfill. To individual consumers this concept is called environmental consumerism or green shopping. It means that you consider the health of the environment when spending your consumer dollars by selecting products and packages that are environmentally sound you take an active role in decreasing waste!



Over Packaging

We have become an over packaged society. We love packaging, almost everything is wrapped in something. Some products have layers upon layers of wrapping. Guess who is paying for it all? You are! Packaging is important, it protects products from damage but in many cases it is overkill. Disposal of packaging materials contributes to the high percentage of trash we throw away everyday. You can do something about it.

Give your trash a second chance.  Recycle.

"Recycled" vs. "Recyclable" — What's the Difference!!

Because environmental awareness is so popular, many companies are eager to respond to consumers' requests for "good" products. As a result, many products are stamped with environmental catch-phrases, such as "recyclable," "recycled," "biodegradable," or "ozone-friendly."

Currently, there are no legal definitions for these environmental claims. The result is that consumers are often confused and misled. As a general rule:

- Products are **RECYCLABLE** only if your local recycling program accepts them.
- **RECYCLED** means that an item has been made partially or entirely from recycled materials. Look for the words "**post-consumer**," especially on paper products, in relation to recycled content. This means the item was made from materials that were bought, used, recycled and remanufactured.
- **BIODEGRADABILITY** is relevant only if you plan to put the item in your compost pile. Almost nothing biodegrades in a landfill, where light and air are scarce. Plastics which claim to be biodegradable in reality only break down to small bits of plastic, and are generally unsuitable for recycling.

PREPARATION INSTRUCTIONS BRUSH AND BRANCHES

- Brush and branches should be **placed on the curb (not in the roadway)** on your scheduled date no earlier than the Saturday prior to your scheduled date and no later than 7:00 AM.
- Branches less than 1" in diameter must be tied in neat bundles at the curb, no more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet across.
- Branches over 1" in diameter should be placed neatly and separately at the curb (ready for chipping), with the cut ends facing in the same direction.
- The bundles and branches should be kept separately or stacked less than 30" in height.
- **Limit of Debris:** 7 cubic yards (3' high x 3' wide x 21' long). These amounts will be strictly adhered to.

LEAVES

- Leaves must be left *in piles* (not bags) at the curbside no earlier than the Saturday prior to your scheduled date and no later than 7:00 AM.
- Do not block storm water catch basins.
- Rake leaves to gutter line, not to the middle of the street.
- Remove all brush, grass, branches, yard waste, pine cones, and garbage from leaf piles.

MUNICIPAL POLICIES

STORM DAMAGE Any damage due to wind shears, hurricanes, or tornadoes, as determined by the National Weather Service, not Marlboro Township, will be cleaned up by the Department of Public Works. Residents must contact the Department of Public Works at 732 536-0188 to find out if any additional pickups have been scheduled.

SNOW DAMAGE Property placed in the street, such as basketball hoops, that are damaged during snow removal, are NOT the responsibility of Marlboro Township. If your mailbox has been damaged due to snow removal, please call the Road Maintenance Bureau at 732 972-8866 or Public Works at 732 536-0188. The Township will send out a supervisor to inspect the damage.

TIP: HOW TO AVOID BEING SNOWED-IN

- When snow is on the way, Public Works suggests residents remove all cars and vehicles from the street. *Please be aware that our plows will always deposit some snow at the end of your driveway.*
- Please park vehicles on your driveway so that the first car that has to get out is the last parked in the driveway.
- Parking on the driveway will give you less snow to shovel and a drier surface when pulling out.
- When shoveling, pile the snow to the right of the driveway (Looking out to the street from your house).
- Shoveling or piling snow into the roadway will create a hazardous condition and is a violation of Marlboro Township Ordinance 66-4 (Obstruction of Streets).

LANDSCAPER/CONTRACTOR DEBRIS REMOVAL

The Solid Waste and Recycling Ordinance of Marlboro Township requires all building and landscaping contractors to remove all debris and materials they generate. The Township's recycling contractor will not pick up any of these materials. Please help us keep costs down by avoiding breaking the law. Residents can report incidents of illegal dumping to Marlboro Township Police Chief Bruce Hall, Emergency Management Coordinator at 732 536-0100 or the Marlboro Township Code Enforcement Officer at 732 536-0200.

SOLID WASTE COLLECTIONS

Marlboro Township does not provide solid waste collection services. Homeowners must independently contract with private haulers. We are presently aware of three companies collecting solid waste in our municipality. The list is not all-inclusive, nor does Marlboro Township recommend one company over another. Residents are encouraged to call each company to discuss their current rates and terms of service.

What will happen if I put items out after my scheduled pickup date?

Materials may be brought to the Municipal Recycling Center or you may contact a private hauler. If the violation continues, steps may be taken by the Township in accordance with Chapter 72 of the Code of the Township of Marlboro. Yard debris can create dangerous conditions: flooding, skidding, slipping, sight distance blockage, and fire hazards (dry leaves).

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle



Many items we throw away every day have the potential to be reused for their original purposes or for new ones. Reuse allows you to get the most out of the products you buy and saves you money as well. Additionally, reusing products conserves natural resources and saves valuable landfill space.

Who Should Reuse?

Everyone should. YOU can start by reusing items for their original purposes. Buy reusable and refillable food containers. Repair broken or worn items such as appliances. Mend shoes, re-upholster furniture and patch clothing. And don't forget that if you can't use it, there's probably someone who can. Try giving clothes, magazines, furniture, etc., away. Possible recipients are nursing homes, day care facilities, schools, churches and the Salvation Army.

When you've determined that an item can't possibly be reused for its original purpose--and don't be hasty to jump to this conclusion--call on your imagination. You will soon find that much of what you thought was trash is made up of many valuable resources.

What to Reuse?

Anyone can reuse almost any material.

Paper is the largest component of our waste stream. Here are some ways to cut down the amount of paper we use:

- Cut up one-sided flyers and use the pieces for notepaper to keep by the telephone or use for shopping lists.
- Write your shopping lists on junk mail return envelopes, or any used envelope and carry your coupons inside the envelope.
- Wrap postal packages in brown paper bags that you've saved.
- Reuse gift wrap for gifts or line shelves and drawers with it.

Plastic is water-resistant, durable, lightweight and temperature tolerant. It can be very reuseful!

- Fill empty plastic bottles (such as mouthwash bottles) with water and freeze to use in your coolers for picnics and camping.
- Use yogurt, dip, or cream-cheese containers to hold individual portions of gelatin or pudding in the refrigerator or in a lunch pack (or use them to pack cookies and chips so they won't get crushed).
- Reuse "microwavable" dishes for the microwave, or for picnics,

- Punch holes in small jar caps to create a spice or cheese shaker.
- Keep bits and pieces, such as screws or nails, in jars and know at a glance what's inside.

Metals are another candidate for reuse.

- Use a tuna can with the top and bottom removed to cook a neat poached egg or use the same can as a cookie cutter.
- Reuse aluminum foil many times.

Where to Reuse?

Anyone can reuse almost any material anywhere.

Here are some ideas:

In the Home

- Keep a sponge and towel near a roll of paper towels to remind you to only use paper towels when necessary.
- Use stale bread for croutons, crumbs, stuffing or french toast.
- Reuse small boxes to organize desk and dresser drawers.
- Use rechargeable batteries.
- Use old toothbrushes to scrub hard-to-reach places.

In the Office

- Make two-sided copies.
- Circulate original memos instead of making numerous copies.
- Use one-sided scrap paper for notes and drafts.

Outdoors

- Use egg cartons to grow seedlings.
- Use dish or bath water to water the garden, especially during a drought.
- Leave grass clippings on the lawn to serve as a mulch and fertilizer.

With the Kids

- Give children free reign over your unwanted papers, cardboard scraps and packaging--their creativity will take over from there.

Remember the 3 R's—Reduce, Reuse, Recycle!

Here are a few tips:

- Buy in bulk and in concentrated form--it saves you money and uses less packaging material.
- Avoid disposables--they're almost always unnecessary.
- Avoid over-packaged products.
- Borrow or rent things you seldom use, such as power tools.

Glass can be very practical for in-home storage of just about anything.

- Turn a large pickle jar into a cookie jar.

• Give preference to items made from recycled materials or to those which are recyclable--then to be sure to recycle them!



RECYCLING LIGHT BULBS



Bulbs, Breakage & Contamination

If you've ever dropped a tube fluorescent bulb on concrete, you'll recognize the pop and puff of vapor that results. That puff of vapor contains mercury, a toxin and environmental contaminant. A small amount of mercury is also contained in the curlicue tube of a CFL, the energy efficient bulbs that is touted as a great way to go green.

To put your mind at ease, one CFL possess 100 times less mercury than in an older glass thermometer, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Still, because most of the mercury can be recovered if the bulb is intact, recycling is the responsible way to dispose of burned-out CFLs (and tube fluorescent bulbs, too.)

If you break a CFL

1. Open a window and leave the room for at least 15 minutes so vapors can disperse
2. Wearing disposable rubber gloves, carefully scoop up fragments and powder with stiff paper or cardboard. Then wipe the area clean with a damp paper towel or disposable wet wipe and use sticky tape to pick up small pieces and powder. (Don't use a vacuum cleaner for the initial cleanup; that will disperse any remaining mercury vapor in the air and leave particles in the bag.)

Replace (1) 100 watt bulb with a 30 watt compact fluorescent bulb and cut more than 1,300 lbs. of carbon dioxide pollution over the life of the bulb. Two bulbs will lower household emissions by more than a ton. Visit LightBulbRecycling.com.

3. Place all cleanup materials and gloves in a plastic bag and seal it. Recycle. Or in if your state allows it, seal the CFL in two plastic bags and put it in the outside trash. Wash your hands.
4. The first time you vacuum the area where the bulb was broken, remove the vacuum bag when you're done cleaning (or empty and wipe the canister). Put the bag/or vacuum debris, as well as the cleaning materials, in two sealed plastic bags and put in the outdoor trash for normal disposal.
