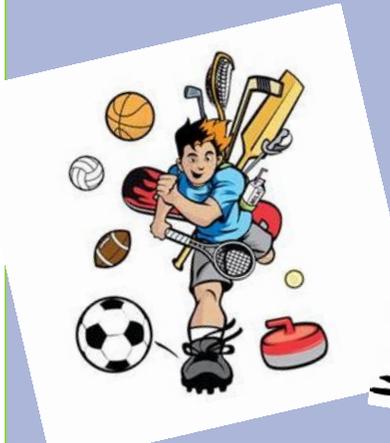

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## GENERAL INFORMATION

- Marlboro's Recreation programs are open to all Marlboro Township residents. Select programs are available to non-residents.
- Children must be currently enrolled in an accredited kindergarten program or higher grade in September 2016 to be eligible to participate, unless other age minimum is stated.
- Each participant must be fully registered (including payment of registration fee) to be eligible to participate in any program.
- The Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel any course which is not fully registered and to limit registration for designated courses. Registration fees are not refundable except for the above situations. **No refund after program begins.**
- Scholarships are available for residents for whom fee payments would impose a financial hardship. Application for such a scholarship should be made with the Public Assistance Officer at 732-617-0100.
- INCLEMENT WEATHER: If schools are closed during the day, no recreation programs will be held regardless of weather conditions that evening. Every attempt will be made to make up cancelled sessions, but we cannot guarantee that all cancelled sessions will be made up.
- The Recreation Department reserves the right to suspend any individual enrolled in a program for disciplinary reasons. Neither partial nor full refund will be made.
- Further questions may be directed to the Recreation Office at 732-617-0100 between 8:30am and 4:00pm Monday through Friday.
- Credit cards (Visa or MC), checks, or money orders made payable to Marlboro Recreation will be accepted.  
*DO NOT SEND CASH.*
- Class Refund Policy: Refund requests must be made to the Recreation Office no less than five (5) business days prior to the start of the program.
- **Returned Check Fee - \$20.00 / Charge for Refunds - \$5.00.**
- **REGISTRATION DEADLINE: One week prior to first class!**

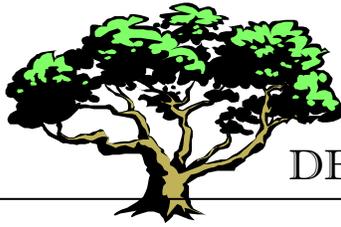

## SUMMER CAMP 2017

**Summer Day Camp** is set up into 2, 3-week sessions and runs Monday through Friday, approximately 9:00am to 3:00 pm. You have the option of signing up for a three-week session or for all six weeks. There is no camp on the July 4th holiday. Our program is located in schools throughout the Township. The Summer Day Camp serves children currently in grades K-6 (**2016-2017 school year**). Daily on-site activities include sports & games, arts & crafts, “theme days”, races & contests, and much more. Exciting trips to local bowling alleys, amusement parks, area movies and more. Several times each week, all campers and staff are bussed to our Aquatic Center where campers swim and play in our “zero depth” pool (0’to 5’), play under the refreshing spray features, laugh on one of the two water slides, or just relax with friends by the pool. Each camper is made to feel like an individual in an atmosphere where they can succeed and have an enjoyable experience.



**Travel Camp** is for 7th and 8th graders (**2016-2017 school year**). Campers will spend five weeks visiting some of the Tri-State Area’s most exciting attractions via coach busses to enjoy some summertime fun. They will spend their days at water and amusement parks, tubing down the Delaware River, taking in sporting events, visiting some of Jersey’s beautiful beaches, and so much more.
